Aims of the 4th ACSB

- Pre-work, agenda and schedule were designed with the primary aim of delivering proposals on the ingredients in the ASEAN Handbook of Cosmetic Ingredients (AHCI) to the ACC Meeting today
- A new Co-chair had to be proposed and accepted by the ACSB team



Report from the 3rd ACSB (KL) - 1

- The next ACSB will be smaller and will aim to go through the whole ASEAN Handbook, ingredient proposal by ingredient proposal.
- All members will be prepared to either agree to the proposals on behalf of their country or to discuss the proposals in detail if necessary.



Report from the 3rd ACSB (KL) - 2

- The aim of the meeting will be to separate out those ingredients that can be moved easily from the ASEAN handbook from those which require additional scientific analysis.
- A satisfactory output from the next meeting will be a large number of solid recommendations for changes that the subsequent ACC can endorse.



Output from the 4th ACSB - 1

- ACSB Members did a considerable amount of work before the meeting.
- Proposals for all ingredients in the ASEAN Handbook were pre-circulated
- Although not all members responded with their agreement/disagreement to the proposals ahead of the meeting we are able to report excellence progress



Output from the 4th ACSB - 2

- All 96 ingredients in the AHCI were discussed in the true ASEAN spirit of co-operation and compromise
- Proposals for 77 ingredients were agreed unanimously. These are now available for endorsement and transcription into the ASEAN Directive annexes by the ACC
- If accepted by ACC these proposals will leave only 19 ingredients in the AHCI



Output from the 4th ACSB - 3

- Actions to deliver proposals for the remaining 19 ingredients were agreed and assigned
- Actions to review the 600+ ingredients banned in the EU since the ASEAN Directive annexes were drafted will deliver a significant number of proposals to the next ACC meeting
- ACSB will continue to review changes made to the other EU Directive annexes in the 6th ACSB and onwards



Other Key Points

- In a discussion on the use of CFCs as ingredients it was agreed that environmental issues currently lay outside the remit of the ACSB as these are normally addressed by cross-sectoral National regulations. ACSB looks to ACC to confirm that this is the case.
